

## HIGH PROFILE CASES

- *AB and others v Ministry of Defence* [2009] EWHC 1225 (QB) – the ‘Atomic Veterans’ case
- *Shoosmith v Ofsted and others* [2010] EWHC 852 (Admin) – the case arising out of the dismissal of Sharon Shoosmith in the wake of the ‘Baby P’ case
- *Bryant and others v Commissioner of Metropolitan Police* [2011] EWHC 1314 (Admin) – whether various well-known individuals, including Lord Prescott, had an arguable judicial review case arising from ‘phone hacking’
- *Furmedge and ors v Chester-le-Street District Council and ors* [2011] EWHC 1226 (QB) – case concerning the apportionment of responsibility for the accident involving the “interactive public art event” known as ‘Dreamspace V’
- *Childrens’ Rights Alliance for England v Secretary of State for Justice and others* [2012] EWHC 8 (Admin) – concerned the ill-treatment of young offenders in one or other of the four Secure Training Centres in the UK
- *Z v Secretary of State for the Home Department and others* [2013] EWHC 498 (Admin) – concerned the use of force to facilitate the removal from the UK of those who have no legal right to be here and who display a reluctance to cooperate with the process of removal
- *London Borough of Islington and others v Mayor of London and others* [2013] EWHC 4142 (Admin) – whether the then Mayor of London (Boris Johnson) was justified in making alterations to the fire services in London
- *Gibson v Waverley Brough Council and others* [2015] EWHC 3784 (Admin) – whether the house that belonged to Sir Arthur Conan Doyle could be altered
- *Various claimants v Giambrone, etc.*, [2015] EWHC 1946 (QB) – whether a large number of claimants could successfully sue an Italian lawyer for damages arising from failed purchases of holiday homes in Calabria
- *Foster v McNicol* [2016] EWHC 1966 (QB) – whether the Leader of the Opposition (Jeremy Corbyn) could stand as the Leader of the Parliamentary Labour Party without requiring a minimum number of supporters

- *Siddiqui v The Chancellor, Masters & Scholars of the University of Oxford* [2018] EWHC 184 (QB) –whether the claimant could succeed in a claim for damages against Oxford University on the grounds that his tuition was negligently inadequate and in consequence received a less favourable degree than would otherwise have been the case
- *Solicitors Regulation Authority v Day and others* [2018] EWHC 2726 (Admin) – whether the dismissal of charges against Mr Day and others (of Leigh Day) by the SDT was justified
